Grant/Funding Opportunities

Rural Futures Institute (RFI) Student Serviceship Opportunity

Communities can apply to the Rural Futures Institute to host a nine-week summer internship for high capacity University of Nebraska student leaders to assist with locally identified community improvement projects. Communities are required to have a group of 4-8 people to craft the project plan for the student, one primary mentor, office space and basic supplies, housing, and funding to support projects and interns' stipends (appx. \$8,000 per pair). Greater Good Grants

The Panhandle Partnership is accepting applications for community-based projects in areas of community capacity enhancement, construction, renovation, or purchase/improvement of a property or equipment. Only communities in the Nebraska Panhandle are eligible to apply. Projects should demonstrate open, inclusive collaboration and benefit all citizens of the community. Projects must also

demonstrate sustainability after grant fund infusion and funds may not be used for operations of programs. Applications are due by 5:00 pm MT on November 30, 2017. Awards are made by January 1, 2018. The Civic and Community Center Financing Fund (CCCF) program provides grants of state aid for the development of civic, community, and recreation centers. The purpose of this program is to support, enhance, and grow the Good Life throughout Nebraska. CCCFF grants are awarded to municipalities and administered by the Nebraska Department of Economic Development to encourage and foster quality of life in our communities. This is a competitive program. Letters of intent to apply are due January 15 with a full application due February 15. Anticipated award date is March 30, 2018. Rural Energy for America Program-2017

The Rural Business Cooperative Service (the Agency) announces the acceptance of applications under the Rural Energy for America Program (REAP) which is designed to help agricultural producers and rural small businesses reduce energy costs and consumption and help meet the Nation's critical energy needs. REAP have two types of funding assistance: (1) Renewable Energy Systems and Energy Efficiency Improvements Assistance, and (2) Energy Audit and Renewable Energy Development Assistance Grants. The Renewable Energy Systems and Energy Efficiency Improvement Assistance provides grants and guaranteed loans to agricultural producers and rural small businesses to purchase and install renewable energy systems and make energy efficiency improvements to their operations. Eligible renewable energy systems for REAP provide energy from: Wind, solar, renewable biomass (including anaerobic digesters), small hydro-electric, ocean, geothermal, or hydrogen derived from these renewable

resources. The Energy Audit and Renewable Energy Development Assistance Grant is available to a unit of State, Tribal, or local government; instrumentality of a State, Tribal, or local government; institution of higher education; rural electric cooperative; a public power entity; or a council, as defined in 16 U.S.C. 3451. The recipient of grant funds, grantee, will establish a program to assist agricultural producers and rural small businesses with evaluating the energy efficiency and the potential to incorporate renewable energy technologies into their operations.

Transportation Innovation Act Economic Opportunity

This is a program from the Nebraska Department of Roads to encourage businesses to make a difference in Nebraska. The goal of the program is attract or retain jobs and private capital investment in Nebraska, to make grant funds for strategic transportation improvements, and to connect businesses to Nebraska's multimodal transportation system. Brownfields Assessment Funds Available through NDEQ

Nebraska Department of Environmental Quality (NDEQ) has funds made available through the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to perform Phase I and II assessments of brownfields properties. Communities or a non-profit organization must be the applicant for the funds to perform these assessments. Private individuals and businesses can partner with current landowners, PADD, and their municipality to agree to have these sites assessed at no cost to them. 2017 Grant Planning

Communities wishing to develop a successful CDBG application need to take steps now to complete income surveys (if not eligible by ACS), blight studies, or other public input avenues such as community needs surveys.
